Are we a good match?

There are four factors which serve as a guide for our community panel when considering which projects to support. These are:



Relevance: Foster a better understanding of religious and non-religious worldviews among young people and children.



Creativity: Development of new and innovative home education materials or experiences.



Impact: A positive influence on your home education showcased through improved understanding or long term benefits.



Collaboration: Share and exchange resources and ideas with the home education community.

Your project doesn't need to match all of these themes, but the more it meets the greater chance of success.

You can use these questions to guide your thinking:



Is it relevant?

- Does your project encourage an **educational understanding** of religious and non-religious worldviews among children and young people?
- Does it support activities that encourage **well-informed and respectful** attitudes towards religion and worldviews?
- Will it enrich children and young people's learning by **exploring diverse perspectives** on religion and worldviews?



Is it impactful?

- Will your project have a **positive influence** on your home education journey and/or those of others?
- Will it show how it's made a difference and led to better **understanding and engagement** with religious and non-religious worldviews?
- Are there likely to be **long-term benefits** from the project?



Is it creative?

- Will your project use the powers of creativity, play or imagination?
- Will it involve creating something new and different (physical or digital)?
- Will it lead to new and unique opportunities for learning about religion and worldviews?



Is it collaborative?

- Does your project encourage **conversation and collaboration** among home educators?
- Will it promote the **sharing of resources, ideas and best practice** within the home education community?
- Do you have ideas for how the resource, project or activity could be **widely shared**, so that lots of people can benefit from it?

The panel will also be looking for projects that are good value for money, so please consider this in your application.

What the fund is not for...

The fund is not designed for projects aimed at the promotion of one particular religion or worldview as better than another. We are not able to fund projects or activities that would take place outside of the United Kingdom.

The fund has a zero tolerance policy for hate speech or prejudice.
